Given that one of his best friends was from Mexico, he frequently had conversations about Hispanic culture and language, which made him want to learn Spanish. FOREIGN FILMS @ THE YALE-NUS LIBRARY: LADRI DI BICICLETTE- BICYCLE THIEVES

Ladri di biciclette is genius in its simplicity; set in post-World War II, povertyparalyzed Rome, it is considered a classic of Italian neorealism. It follows Antonio Ricci, a working-class man with a universal pursuit: to find a job. After a job posting for a man with a bicycle comes his way, an inescapable cycle of theft, poverty and regrets ensues.

The movie rejects most Hollywood conventions, featuring non-professional actors and employing a documentary technique, following a working-class man as he faces challenges big and small. The protagonist is everyman, and any man's story would be similar to his, but unique in its own way. Thus is the plight of the poor: to suffer alone yet together.
