

#### **AKIRA KUROSAWA'S RASHOMON**



In September 1951, the Venice Film Festival awarded its top prize, the Golden Lion, to *Rashomon*, by a little-known Japanese director, Akira Kurosawa. Immediately, the film and its maker became international sensations. It is easy to see why, given its dynamic cinematic technique, sensationalistic story, intense musical score, and tantalizing if schematic structure of flashbacks contradicting one another. The title quickly entered the English language and became shorthand for the relativity of truth: "the Rashomon effect," invoked to indicate how witnesses to the same event may see it differently.

You can borrow a DVD copy of *Rashomon* from the Yale-NUS Library. Give it a try and practice some Japanese along the way.

- On 5 October, Yale-NUS hosted <u>Dr. Rebecca</u> <u>Oxford</u>, a renowned language educator, as part of the **Language Speaker Series**. Dr. Oxford spoke to students, faculty, and external guests on different types of peace and ways to promote peace-building in language teaching. Attendees engaged in peace-making scenarios and came out with a better understanding of conflict and resolving it through communication that can be incorporated into language instruction.
