About the talk

Slander! represents an extension of Jeremy Sharma's research into the films and popular culture of Singapore in the 1950s and 1960s. While A White, White Day was based on the dissolution of the cinematic image, Slander! is an extended inquiry into fiction and visibility in film while linking elements of writing and autobiography is Sharma's ever-morphing and experimental art practice.
